

Mustard Seeds

♣ First Gift of Advent: Time to know your Deepest Longings

As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God? My tears have been my food day and night, while people say to me continually, "Where is your God?" Psalm 42:2-4. One day on a winter's walk in the woods I came face to face with a deer. Our town had been in the midst of a stretch of very cold weather, and the stream I was walking along was mostly frozen over. I had stopped at a place where the swift current of the stream broke through to the surface and swirled around before it disappeared back under the ice. As I sat for a while watching and listening to the gurgling water, a deer quietly appeared. We stared at one another for a few moments and, sensing I was no threat, the deer moved to the edge of the water and drank deeply. I recalled the words, "As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God." I had been experiencing a kind of winter in my soul. There were few signs of life, and the Spirit of God seemed to have become frozen over within me. Somehow, I was drawn to this external image of my internal longing — flowing water finding a way to bubble up from beneath solid ice. It was Advent and I was longing, even though I was barely aware of my discontent. Like everyone else I had been caught up in the busyness of Christmas preparations. Though we had lit the Advent candles at home and I had tried to pray, I needed more. I needed time to really allow my sense of longing to swirl up and become clear to me as it did on that winter's walk in the woods. I knew then that I needed a closer relationship to God and that I had to stop just going through the motions of my prayer life. My longing, once acknowledged, turned out to be an invitation to live with a deeper awareness of God's presence and care all around me. What are you longing for? What is your heart trying to tell you? The gift God offers this first week of Advent is the invitation to explore your inner longings. The Church, through our Advent customs, and even the weather of the season itself support such inner work.



During the first week of Advent, give yourself time and space to contemplate what you are truly longing for in life. Know that this is the season when your longings will lead you to the Christ Child, in whom the hopes and fears of all the years are known and responded to with generous love.

The Synod in Galloway – Quotes from our Report

unanimously, people appeared conscious of the missionary nature of the Church; however it was undisputed that large numbers of people have been left behind, and that we need to reach out to them. The dimension of mission poses unique challenges to our rural parishes, where the logistics and economic impact of supporting and connecting with the most isolated people in a disperse community are considerable. Outreach coordinators were suggested as a possibility for beginning to manage this difficulty. There was a strong sense that the synodal journey will be embraced by our most rural parishes, and there is already evidence of the fruits of this as individual synodal pathways emerge. Almost every synodal response highlighted our need to better reach out to and support families, children and young people. Many people felt that we have the solution to this already at our disposal: "if the meaning of the Eucharist was understood by all, we would as the church, lack nothing"."

Message of the Advent Wreath

The Advent Wreath can be a way to involve even very little children in learning about Christian preparation - not only for celebrating Our Lord's birth, but to make our hearts truly ready to receive Him. The wreath's symbolism of the advent (coming) of Light into the world is clear. The gradual lighting of the four candles, one on each Sunday of the Advent season, combined with the liturgical colours of the candles (purple is the penitential colour used during Advent and Lent; rose is a liturgical colour used only on Gaudete Sunday in Advent and Laetare Sunday in Lent) help to symbolise not only our expectation and hope in Our Saviour's first coming into the world, but also in his Second Coming as Judge at the end of the world. The wreath itself is also symbolic. The circle of evergreen in which the candles are placed represents everlasting life.

Just for a Laugh... A mother was teaching her three year old daughter the Our Father Prayer. For several evenings at bedtime she repeated it after her mother. One night she said she was ready to do it on her own. The mother listened with pride as she carefully enunciated each word right up to the end. "Lead us not into temptation" she prayed, "but deliver us some E-mail, Amen".
